

## Estimated Cost of Attendance

The cost of private education requires a great deal of investment for anyone thinking of going to college. To help with planning your educational cost, the Office of Financial Aid estimates your Cost of Attendance (COA) for the academic year.

Each semester, the Business Office will bill you for tuition, fees, housing, meal plans, and health insurance, if applicable. Students who are less-than-full-time will have certain expenses adjusted based on the number of credits for which they are enrolled; after the end of each semester's add/drop period.

The Indirect costs such as books, transportation, and personal expenses are not payable to GTS. These items are estimated to ensure that your COA is as accurate as possible to help you and your family plan for the overall cost of your education.

The illustration below outlines your estimated COA, before accounting for institutional scholarships and other awards.
